Employer Research: findings now available

Two national organisations were part of the final phase of the Employer Mobilisation Project to design and test workplace interventions to help better support people with a health condition and disability. Here's a sample of what employers shared on key themes during the co-design process.



Workplace policy

'I want a policy which clearly shows support, expectations, commitment so that we have a consistent approach.'

Workplace culture

'I want to model an inclusive safe culture (with) zero tolerance for incivility and bullying behaviour.'



'I want to recruit and retain people in all stages of their lives, so that people feel valued and have equal career opportunities.'

Identify relevant roles

'I want to identify job share roles and/or specific roles that cater to different (health conditions and) disabilities.'

Education and training

'I want one source of truth so I can gain access to education tools to assist with any situation.'



'I want peer to peer support so we can continue to improve how we work with people with (health conditions) and disabilities.'
