Comcare and self-insurance under the SRC Act

Comcare:

- administers the SRC Act and WHS Act;
- is a fully cost-recovered agency;
- has a national presence with offices in every state and territory and approximately 650 FTE across all its functions.

Self-insurance under the SRC Act provides:

- a single nationally streamlined approach to managing workers' compensation;
- uniform conditions for all employees covered, regardless of their geographical location.



What are licence fees and why do we charge them?

Comcare implements cost recovery for functions and activities conducted under the:

Safety, Rehabilitation and Compensation Act 1988 (SRC Act) and

Work Health and Safety Act 2011 (WHS Act)

These encompass functions and activities across three broad categories:

The Safety, Rehabilitation & Compensation Commission (SRCC) functions and activities

Comcare WHS Act functions and activities; and

Comcare SRC Act functions and activities

How is a licence fee calculated?

Ongoing charges

- Each licensee is charged an equal share of costs for ongoing SRCC activities.
- Ongoing functions and activities under the SRC Act and WHS Act (if applicable) are charged to each licensees on a per FTE basis.

Variable charges

- Comcare charges licensees for activities such as inspections, audits and monitoring of claims systems.
- These services have fixed prices and are charged on an as-used basis using information from the most recently completed calendar year.

The Cost Recovery Implementation Statement (CRIS)

 Updated annually, the CRIS provides further details on these charges as well as how Comcare implements cost recovery for self-insurers to cover all estimated costs for relevant activities under the SRC Act and WHS Act.




Total fees collected

2023-24 LICENCE FEES

- **\$22m** across all licensees. Consisting of:
 - **\$19.5m (89%)** in ongoing costs allocated;
 - **\$2.5m (11%)** variable charges; including investigations, inspections, responses to disputes and monitoring costs.
- Total variable charges will vary year on year depending on regulatory activity undertaken by Comcare



Key trends impacting fees





Cost Recovery Review

In 2023, Deloitte completed a review of the Cost Recovery process at Comcare. The recommendations were across four themes covering:

1.	Governance	Immediate focus
2.	Methodology	Longer term (12 months +)
3.	Stakeholder engagement	6 – 12 months
4.	Compliance	6 – 12 months



Key dates

TARGET DATES FOR LICENCE FEES

- Indicative fees April
- Final fees and invoices end of June
- Payment is due within 30 days from invoice date
- Variable charge details provided to licensees in September and February
- Licensees have up until the end of February to provide updated FTE details
